

HISTORY & ADVENTURE

One of the best routes to Yellowstone National Park from Denver International Airport is to go north on Interstate-25 and take the 269B exit, follow the signs to Laramie on Highway 287. In Laramie stop at one of our 12 museums and spend the night at a hotel or guest ranch! From Laramie head west and take Highway 130 on the Snowy Range Scenic Byway. Make a stop in Centennial for coffee or lunch at one of the quaint restaurants. Then head north over the mountains to Saratoga, take a free dip in the Hobo Hot Springs in Saratoga. Continue your journey to Interstate 80 and head west to Rawlins. In Rawlins get back on Highway 287 head north to Yellowstone. You will go through Lander, Dubois to Moran Jct. where you will have a spectacular view of the Teton Range. (See map below)



HISTORIC ROAD TRIP!

The Snowy Range Scenic Byway, Highway 130, was built as a wagon road in the 1870s. Fifty years later the road was widened and graded using horse-drawn equipment. The road was finally paved in the 1930s and was designated as the nation's second Scenic Byway in 1988.
