



Umpqua-Rogue Scenic Byway

What you need to know

Dress Accordingly

At an elevation of over 6000', it is often up to 10 degrees cooler at the rim than in the valleys and towns below.

It's Remote

Download your directions! You will be out of cellular range for much of the drive. GPS may be spotty or unreliable. While the drive is well signed, you'll want to print out or download your maps.

Have cash and/or a Senior Pass

Effective May 13, 2018 the entrance fees to the park will be \$25 per vehicle and \$20 per motorcycle. Then effective January 1, 2020 the entrance fees to the park will be \$30 per vehicle and \$25 per motorcycle. The America the Beautiful senior pass is accepted at Crater Lake National Park. A \$5 day use fee applies to popular trail heads, waterfalls and picnic spots.

Drive time: 3.5 Hours + Stops: 5.5 Hours = Total 9 Hours

Deadline Falls: Easily accessible just off of Highway 138, an ADA accessible quarter mile trail takes you to a viewpoint of Deadline Falls. Recommended time: 15 Minutes

Steamboat Falls: Take a 5.3 mile side spur off of Highway 138 to Steamboat Falls. An easy 0.6 mile loop trail will take you to the falls which are popular for cliff jumping in the summer and watching the salmon migrate up the river in the fall and winter. Recommended time: 30 Minutes

Whitehorse Falls: This spectacular falls is easily accessible from Whitehorse Falls Campground along Highway 138. It has a stunning ADA accessible boardwalk and viewing platform overlooking the stunning falls. Recommended time: 15 Minutes

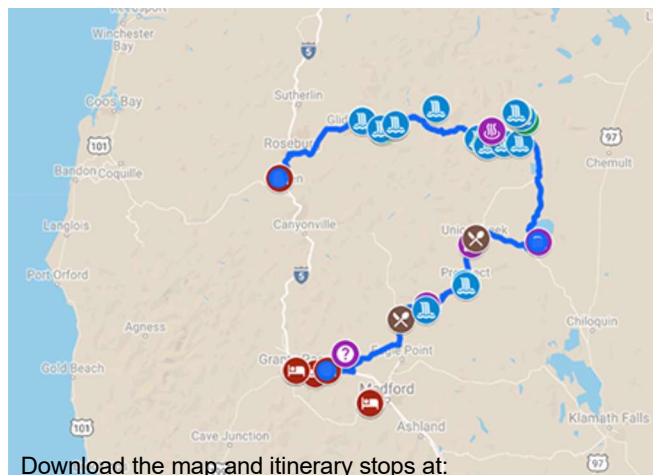
Clearwater Falls: Also accessible from a campground along Highway 138, Clearwater Falls provides beautiful views as the Clearwater River cascades down the mountains. Recommended time: 15 Minutes

Crater Lake: Your premier destination. Enjoy your picnic and check in at the Rim Village Visitor's Center to find out about interactive learning activities, conditions of the rim drive, area hikes and much more. Recommended time: 90 Minutes

Becky's: As you descend the mountain, stop on in for some world famous pie in Union Creek. Recommended time: 30 Minutes

Rogue Gorge: Easily accessible viewpoint of the upper Rogue River as it cuts through a basalt cavern with impressive color and beauty. Recommended time: 15 Minutes

Natural Bridge: Also in Union Creek, the Rogue River mysteriously disappears into an ancient lava tube only to reappear a few hundred feet downstream. This easily accessible viewpoint and trail is well maintained, and fairly flat, but may not be ideal for mobility devices. Recommended time: 15 Minutes

Cole Rivers Hatchery: If you have youngsters in your group, stop on in at the Fish Hatchery at the base of Lost Creek Lake. Learn about the salmon migration, feed the fish and watch as they navigate the fish ladders. Recommended time: 30 Minutes.

Crawfoot Falls: A short spur off of highway 138 will take you to Crawfoot Falls, a locals' paradise for recreation and swimming. A great place to stretch your legs along the descent from Crater Lake. Recommended time: 30 Minutes

House of Mystery: Open seasonally from March to October, the Oregon Vortex and House of Mystery is a geographic anomaly where an undefined force bends light and perception for a truly mystifying experience. Recommended time: 30 Minutes
