Joliet Area Historical Museum & Route 66 Welcome Center

Traveling down Route 66 is not only a getaway; it is a kickin' good experience.





Just south of Chicago on Route 66 in Romeoville is the White Fence Farm, serving home-style food since the 1920's and home to "the best chicken in the world." Inside the restaurant are all kinds of Route 66 memorabilia. Next up is the historic Fitzpatrick House at Lewis University where you will discover the history of the I&M Canal and home to the Heritage Corridor Convention and Visitors Bureau. A kiosk pinpoints highlights of Route 66. Press the button to hear "Get Your Kicks on Route 66" written and sung by Bobby Troup.

Continuing your getaway down Route 66 stop in at the Rich and Creamy. You'll recognize it by the large Jake and Elwood statues of the Blues Brothers movie on top of the roof. Enjoy some ice cream to take on your stroll of Route 66 Park.

Further on in downtown Joliet Route 66 really gets kickin'. Visit the Route 66 Welcome Center located at the Joliet Area Historical Museum and explore both. Stops at the Rialto Square Theatre, Joliet Slammers Baseball Stadium, Route 66 Diner and Harrah's Casino and Hotel are all located within walking distance.
