Whether you're extending your stay after a conference or meeting, or you just want to get away for a long weekend, come discover Peachtree City at 15mph.

Friday

After breakfast, **hop aboard** one of Peachtree City's signature vehicles – a golf cart. Enjoy a host of activities, **tree lined** roadways and scenic views. It's time to unwind. Renting a cart is easy. So, grab your ride and explore the **100 miles of cart paths through five distinct villages**. Bridges, tunnels and paths wind through natural settings of lakes, parks and playgrounds, and connect to shopping, dining, resort-styled hotel/conference centers, golf, and other recreation. The multi-use path system is also ideal for runners, walkers and cyclists.

Outdoorsy types can enjoy **geocaching**, with over 300 local caches to discover. Or let your hotel arrange a tee time and hit the links at one of Peachtree City's three championship golf courses.

Friday is a great day to get in some leisurely **shopping**. Nearly a dozen shops in town specialize in antiques, collectibles, quality furniture consignments and gently used fashions. If you're looking for the latest trends, pop by The Avenue Peachtree City and browse American Eagle, Ann Taylor, Chico's and more.

Then cruise over to the Overlook Shopping Center for great deals at Michael's, TJ Maxx, and HomeGoods. Hungry? Have a fresh-made sandwich from Newk's. As evening approaches, head back to the hotel to freshen up for a night out.

Take your choice of more than 100 restaurants with diverse offerings ranging from Asian to Mediterranean, including Lebanese and South African.

Then, grab your tickets to a production at the outdoor **Serenbe Playhouse** in nearby Palmetto and succumb to the magic, whimsy and escape of this professional theatre, known nationwide as a forerunner in immersive theatre.

If you'd rather be part of the action, get locked in a room with 8 to 10 other people at **Mastermind Games Escape Room** in Peachtree City. Use your surroundings and the clues provided to break out of the room in less than 60 minutes.

After breakfast, take the golf cart out to the Peachtree City Farmer's Market at Aberdeen Village Shopping Center. More than 40 farmers and artisans offer the freshest produce, homemade breads, jams, jellies, local honey, grass-fed meats, goat cheese and so much more.

Make the most of your farmer's market finds by signing up for a cooking class at **Revolution** with Chef Bri Van Scotter. Learn the art of making French macarons, watch warm bread rise or toss pizza dough. Or simply take in the scene with a cup of Revolution's house Oaxacan roast coffee.

Aerophiles will get your aviation fix at **The Dixie Wing Museum** at Falcon Field. Watch the CAF Ghost Squadron recreate, remind and reinforce the lessons learned from the defining moments in American military aviation history with its collection of restored vintage WWII aircraft.

Fans of "The Walking Dead" will love that Peachtree City is only minutes from Senoia where AMC's hit series is filmed.

Join the two-hour Walking Dead Studio Tour for a behind-the-scenes look at the show's most iconic sets: Sanctuary, Hilltop, the Heaps, Alexandria and Woodbury. You can also experience a little bit of Hollywood in Peachtree City aboard The Southern Hollywood Film Tour. Groups will visit famous film and television sites for high-budget films such as Sweet Home Alabama, starring Reese Witherspoon, Joyful Noise, starring Queen Latifah and Dolly Parton, and Marvel Studio's Spider Man Homecoming.

Active types will enjoy one of the bicycle rides led by the folks at **Senoia Bicycle**. Check the calendar at *senoiabicycle.com/about/rides* to discover where and when the next ride is scheduled.

A busy day calls for a relaxing evening at **the "Fred,"** which is local lingo for the Fredrick Brown Jr. Amphitheater. This 2,500-seat, open-air amphitheater in the heart of Peachtree City is an intimate setting that has kept both talented performers and patrons flooding through the gates for more than 30 years. Recent performers include Eddie Money, Lindsey Buckingham, Sister Hazel, and The Commodores, to name a few.



Sunday is for relaxing.

Sleep in, enjoy a leisurely brunch, then head out on the cart paths to take in more of Peachtree City.

Make a stop at Westpark Walk Shopping Center for a tasting at **Branch & Vine's** olive oil and balsamic vinegar tasting bar. You'll also want to stock up from the store's wide selection of loose-leaf teas.

Head over to the Flat Creek Nature Area for a walk on the boardwalk. You may catch a glimpse of herons, beaver, and other native wildlife in this tranquil setting. While you're in the Flat Creek area, look for the Tinsley Mill ruins. On Flat Creek between Lake Kedron and Flat Creek Golf Course, the site features a modern picnic area next to a piece of Peachtree City and Fayette County history. Take advantage of this unique local attraction and savor a luxurious lunch.

Behind City Hall, **Drake Field** on the shores of Lake Peachtree is another great place for relaxation and recreation. You'll find a picnic area perfect for enjoyable afternoon lunches and a multipurpose field for sporting events, as well as fishing in the lake.

Gather around the outdoor fire pits and enjoy live music, food trucks and game watching at Line Creek Brewing Company, Peachtree City's own craft beer brewery and the perfect setting for laid back, cozy nights.
