- Manitowoc is famous for submarines. Thousands of workers built 28 submarines for the World War II effort making Manitowoc a vital defense center.
- The Wisconsin Maritime Museum is the largest maritime museum on the Great Lakes and offers Smithsonian Institution Affiliations Programs.
- USS Cobia, a fully restored WWII submarine, is docked alongside the Wisconsin Maritime Museum and is open for tours year round. You can even sleep aboard the submarine!
- Manitowoc is Wisconsin's port for the S. S. Badger carferry, the largest steam-powered ferry on Lake Michigan.
- Manitowoc is known as the aluminum Christmas tree capitol of the world! In the 1960's Manitowoc's Aluminum Specialty Company produced millions of *EVERGLEAM* all aluminum trees.
- Manitowoc is the only satellite landing site in Wisconsin! On September 5, 1962, a large chunk of Sputnik
 IV landed on 8th Street in front of the Rahr-West Art Museum. SPUTNIKFEST is celebrated the second
 weekend of September each year.
